


- 73% of our students are Catholic

- K-8 Student Retention Rate: 91%






2019-2020 NWEA/MAP Test Results

+ Tuition Assistance

- Approximately 49% of the student body received tuition assistance.
- The calculated need for those applying for tuition was over \$164,887.
- Tuition assistance is offered to all students in Kindergarten-8th grade.
- Assistance and scholarship opportunities are generated through annual donations, school fundraisers, the Annual Fund, and is part of our operating budget funded by tuition.
- A limited amount of assistance is available for Preschool students. The Schulze Family Foundation does have an Early Childhood Learning Scholarship we encourage all families to apply for.
