## **Principal's Corner**



## **Growth Made with Believe and Read Powered by Groves!**

We are in our 2nd year of the CSCOE Believe and Read Program powered by Groves Academy. Through this remarkable program, our students in grades K-3 spend their literacy and writing time working on foundational skills that are based on the science of reading.

We are excited to share our Fall to Winter results from St. Dominic students. Our goal is to have as many students as possible in one of the two green pieces of the pie. We are working to grow our students' reading fluency throughout the year and will share Spring results at a later date. The results below say it all...

Fall 38% Moderate/High Risk 62% At/Above Grade Level <u>Winter</u> 31% Moderate/High Risk 69% At/Above Grade Level

It is through the hard work and dedication of our students and staff that we were able to make this much progress in four short months. All of this growth happened along with us being in distance learning for five weeks...thank you students and teachers!
